## 'AND IT WAS NIGHT'

Elie Wiesel's book *Night* starkly confronts us with the horrors of the Holocaust. Based on his own experiences, Wiesel's account flips the biblical story of the Exodus. While Moses and the Israelites *escaped* slavery at the first Passover.(Exodus 12) Wiesel tells of Jewish leaders being arrested following Passover.

Lest we criticise Wiesel and his dark irony, consider that the Bible contains a similar plot twist. On the night of Passover, Jesus, expected to free God's people from suffering, instead permits Himself to be arrested by those who would kill Him.

John ushers us into the holy scene before Jesus' arrest. 'Troubled in spirit' over what awaited Him, at the Last Supper Jesus predicted His betrayal.(John 13:21) Then, in an act we can scarcely comprehend, Christ served His betrayers bread. The account reads: 'As soon as Judas had taken the bread, he went out. And it was night.'(v30) History's greatest injustice was underway, yet Jesus declared, 'Now the Son of Man is glorified and God is glorified in him'(v31) In a few hours, the disciples would experience panic, defeat, and dejection. But Jesus saw God's plan unfolding as it should.

When it seems as though the darkness is winning, we can recall that God faced His dark night and defeated it. He walks with us. It won't always be night.

June recipe:

ALMOST INSTANT BANANA PUDDING:

Ingredients:

- 4 thick slices of ginger cake
- 6 Bananas
- 2 tblspns Lemon Juice
- ½ pint Whipping Cream or Fromage frais.
- 4 tblspns Fruit juice
- 3 – 4 tblspns Soft brown sugar

Method:

Break up the cake into chunks, arrange in ovenproof dish.  
Slice bananas and toss in the lemon juice  
Whip the cream, and, when firm, gently whip in the juice  
(If using fromage frais, just gently stir in the juice)  
Fold in the bananas and spoon the mixture over the ginger cake.  
Top with soft brown sugar and place under hot grill for 2 – 3 minutes to caramelize. Chill to set firm again if you wish, or serve when required.

## Covid-19 certificates fraudster sentenced to two years in prison

A fraudster who conned holidaymakers in to paying for fake COVID-19 'fit to fly' certificates at the height of the Coronavirus pandemic has been successfully prosecuted by Warwickshire Trading Standards and given an immediate two-year custodial sentence.

Saranjeet Trina KANDOLA (aged 41) of South View Road, Leamington Spa traded as 'Travel Test Solutions Ltd', a business that offered PCR tests for holidaymakers costing between £60 and £149 per person.

The prosecution was brought by Warwickshire County Council's Trading Standards Service following an investigation after a customer became concerned that the certificates they had received were fake.

The trader, who advertised on social media, visited the homes of customers to take swabs that should then have been tested at a laboratory. However, no laboratory tests were ever carried out and the COVID 'free' certificates issued were worthless.

The investigation found that over a 17 day period, KANDOLA had agreed to provide at least 47 certificates obtaining almost £5000. She only stopped marketing her services when she found out she was being investigated by Warwickshire Trading Standards.

### Continued:-True stories from Anne about the village of Whitacre:

On our journeys we often spent our time leaning out the back of the vehicle, waving to passers by, who sometimes waved back. I threw my crusts out to feed the birds and we enjoyed the sensation in our stomachs when we went over a hump backed bridge.

Soon we were back in Whitacre at the White House Cottages. I rushed to check everything. I checked whether the hens had hatched chickens or the goats and rabbits had babies. I scratched the back of the large white sow in the pigsty. Mr. Conway said she weighed twenty score and I gave William a hug and a kiss and made him a slice of bread and jam which I thought would be a treat for him. Within an hour or two we had settled down to our normal life. The next couple of weeks passed very quickly and then it was time for school again. Janet had already started school and David was about to join us. My mother has asked me to ask Mrs. Hicken if he could start, I probably misled her about his age because when I took him she said, 'I thought he was older than this'. However, they kept him, in those more relaxed days a few months here and there didn't matter.

The Old Farm: Now we were all safely at school Mum could carry on with her cleaning job at the Old farm without worrying about us. As I have already mentioned Mum had this job with a family called Thomson and this was the start of an association with the Old farm and its occupants that was to last nearly thirty years until her death.

Mrs. Thomson used to allow Mum to take us children with her when she cleaned during the school holidays, and I'm sure seeing this house and its contents influenced me throughout my life. I have always loved old furniture, china and glass. I didn't know why I liked this old furniture I just knew I loved the smooth shininess of the wood and the deep dark colour. Likewise my mothers taste also changed, previous to this she had been quite content with her veneered utility dining room suite but now she preferred chintz and mahogany to uncut moquette and fumed oak.

The house which had once really been a working farm once having been owned by the Hayfield family in earlier years was a very attractive place. It

was set sideways on the road and was in an 'L' shape. There was a conservatory which ran along from the back door all along the side of the house, but it wasn't a conservatory where one sat amongst exotic

flowers, but really an extension to the kitchen housing storage cupboards and an inside lavatory to be used by 'the help' as Claire Salt said some years later. The kitchen was a functional place with deep sinks and plate racks and also a large cupboard style refrigerator – the first one I ever saw. This kitchen opened out into the breakfast room which had a carved Jacobean dresser a huge table and an Aga. The larders were as big as our cottage, tiled all in white with the shelves full of tins, pockets and packets. I suppose Mr. Thomson being in the fruit trade had contacts and I doubt his family went short of much. There was a little room at the other side of the breakfast room which they called the Butler's pantry, a bit pretentious because the house would never have been grand enough to warrant employing a butler. Above the door leading into the hallway was one of those panels which they had in old houses which shows which room a servant is being summoned from, it was just there for show because there weren't any bell pulls in any of the rooms but I used to imagine the little maid servant running to the 'drawing room' when summoned.


If I had been born 50 years earlier I would probably have been one of those.

In the hallway, with its parquet floor covered by a long Persian runner there was, of all things a telephone!! It was kept on a table at the bottom of the sweeping staircase and I would have loved to have had a 'go' on it, it would have been no use, we didn't know anyone who owned a telephone. Leading off the hallway to the right was the morning room, and they really did use this room in the morning's. It got all the morning sun and was very cosy and comfortable with a deep window seat in the bay window, I thought it was much nicer than the 'drawing room'. The dining room had a brick inglenook fireplace and the usual refectory table, a side - table under the window held silver dishes and salvers, it was one of my mother's jobs to clean these, so she didn't see them in the same light as I did. The drawing room was enormous with a French window at one end leading on to the terrace. I think the furniture was covered with gold damask if my memory serves me correctly, and there was a 'baby grand' in the middle of the room. Ann Thomson was taking piano lessons at her convent school and showed me some five finger exercises and I stretched my little hand to play 'C''D''C''D''E''D''C', to this day that is all I can play on the piano.

FATHERHOOD: Joseph, as far as being a Christian man that is guided by the Holy Spirit given by God when Jesus ask for Him to be sent to earth to be with us. Most men believe that being a good provider means supporting a family financially. ... A man should also contribute to the emotional, spiritual, physical and mental well-being of his family. Joseph was kind. He LOVED Mary. His love for her was based on a real commitment. And husbands, the Bible says we must love our wives with all that we are. Ephesians 5:25 - the example is that we must love our wives sacrificially, even as Christ loved the church and lay down His life for it. But we also see that Joseph was a loving man in his relationship toward Jesus. If loving to Jesus so to his other children also.

When the child came along at first Joseph was in shock. He probably couldn't eat or sleep and his mind was restless over the situation. Then he was visited by an angle: Matthew 1:20: But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit.

Joseph accept the child he had not conceived - there was no attitude in Joseph after his visit by an angel "This boy isn't my flesh and blood". There was no resentment or indifference toward Him; no lack of love at all. Joseph adopted Jesus as his own. He protected Him from the hatred of Herod. He nurtured Him and cared for Him. Evidently he taught Jesus his own trade of carpentry.

He adopted the one that the rest of the world would reject.

*Pentecost is a Christian observance commemorating the descent of the Holy Spirit on Jesus Christ's disciples, according to the Christian Bible. Many Christians in the United Kingdom celebrate Pentecost, which is also known as Pentecost Sunday, Whitsunday, or Whit Sunday.*

## What Do People Do?

Pentecost is a joyous period for many Christians in the United Kingdom. Many churches have special Pentecost services for people – both members and guests – to learn more about Pentecost, its history and the meaning of this occasion in modern times. Whit Sunday is called “Bread and Cheese Day” in Gloucestershire because of an old tradition that involves throwing bread and cheese. Many church groups organise celebrations in venues such as parks or community halls. These celebrations often include speeches from special guests, music, food, activities for children, and opportunities for people to socialize. Pentecost is also a day allocated for baptisms in some churches. Many Christians recognise Pentecost as the birth of the Christian church.

The Pentecost Festival is a Christian festival in London during the Pentecost weekend. The festival features various events including music, sport, art, and cultural events. Many churches and Christian organisations participate in this festival. The Pentecost Festival was first held in 2008 and featured 150 events at more than 60 venues and outdoor spaces. More than 100 people were out on the streets around the events, talking to people and praying.

**Background** According to the Christian Bible, it was on the 50th day after Easter when the apostles prayed together and the Holy Spirit descended on them. They received the “gift of tongues” – the ability to speak in other languages – and immediately began to preach about Jesus Christ to Jewish people from all over the world who flocked to Jerusalem for the Feast of [Shavuot](#).

Christian Pentecost not only commemorated the Holy Spirit's visit but also marked the birth of the Christian Church. Although it is not certain when Christians started observing Pentecost, it may have been early as the first century CE. Whitsuntide, also referred to as Whitsun in modern times, is the period beginning with the Saturday before Whitsunday and ending the following Saturday. According to church tradition, Pentecost is about seven weeks after Easter Sunday, or 50 days after Easter, including Easter Day churches still observe holidays according to the Julian calendar, which preceded the Gregorian calendar adopted by many western churches.

Known for her sense of duty and her devotion to a life of service, she has been an important figurehead for the UK and the Commonwealth during times of enormous social change. Her Majesty continues to carry out a full programme of engagements, from visits to charities and schools, to hosting visiting Heads of State, to leading the nation in Remembrance and celebratory events - all supported by other members of the Royal Family. The Queen sees public and voluntary service as one of the most important elements of her work. The Queen has links - as Royal Patron or President - with over 600 charities, military associations, professional bodies and public service organisations. These vary from well-established international charities to smaller bodies working in a specialist area or on a local basis only.
